On 01/02/21, I was the detective assigned to investigate this case as a follow-up to Officer Jackson's initial report. At 1500 hrs on 01/03/21, I went to Wal-Mart at 121 W Elmsley Dr. where I spoke with the victim in this case, Mr. Jasper Evans, a loss prevention employee of Wal-Mart.

He described the incident which occurred on 01/02/21 and his recollection was consistent with Officer Jackson's initial report. Mr. Evans provided me with a copy of the surveillance video of the incident.

I then checked the NC registration listed in the report ABF-6776. The plate showed to be registered to a 1999 Honda Accord 4 door, tan in color. The car is listed as registered to a Lewis Earl Weathers of 1465 Washington Street in Greensboro. Police records indicate that Mr. Weathers in 6'2" and is 300 pounds. This did not match the description of the suspect.

On 1/03/21, at approximately 1800 hrs, I drove to the address of Mr. Weathers and made contact. He answered the door, identified himself, and I explained to him that his vehicle was linked to a theft occurring at Wal-Mart the prior day before.

Mr. Weathers seemed surprised by the incident and stated that yesterday he was contacted by his friend, Charles Summers, who needed a ride to Wal-Mart because he didn't have a car. Mr. Weathers agreed to drop Mr. Summers off and wait for him at the exit of the store. When Mr. Summers returned to the car, Mr. Weathers drove him home.

At that point, I showed Mr. Weathers a picture of the suspect from the surveillance footage and he agreed that it looked like Charles Lloyd Summers. I left Mr. Weathers' residence and proceeded to the Guilford County Magistrate's Office where I obtained a warrant for arrest for Charles Lloyd Summers for Attempted Robbery with a Dangerous Weapon.

I found out that Mr. Summers was arrested later that evening by the Guilford County Sheriff's Department at his residence at 123 Elm Street, Greensboro.

This case is cleared by arrest.
